Bear Mr. Weiss:

At our recent Quarterly Meeting of the Trustees of the Foundation, we discussed the matters dealt with in your letter of September 6.

In view of the corrections which you mentioned being needed, it seems wise for us to hear further from you as to what your final recommendation will be. Since both sets should be corrected identically, they should be left for the time being with you.

Because of the value of these art paper prints, we would suggest that each of the two sets be kept in a separate place so that damage or catastrophe to both would not occur at the same time due to fire or other causes. To replate the French Translation would be costly in case of loss or damage of these prints. Should these be insured? For what value?

Have the plates been destroyed?

We thoroughly discussed again our original attitude toward the French Translation containing anything other than that which is in the original English version. Since it is our sole responsibility for any decision of this nature, the second edition shall not include either a Glossary or footnotes.

Where footnotes now appear, there will be a blank space in the second edition. A general notice in the beginning of each volume

of the second edition could be inserted stating that the footnotes have been eliminated from the second edition. This eliminates making a complete set of new plates. The footnotes and the numerical references to these footnotes can be blanked out on the art paper prints.

Re: Glossary

Mr. Sadler, Jr. is doing his best to review your rewritten Glossary which you sent him. His business takes him out of the city a great deal and he hopes to have word for you some time in Movember.

Re: Foundation's French Translation Sets

It would seem wise to completely sell out the first edition before printing a second edition. If some of our sets are sent back to France for sale through you, are these sets subject to the sales tax which was originally avoided by shipping them to us?

Re: Second Printing

We are giving further study as to how the second printing should be arranged and have no firm conclusions at this time. As of September 30, there are 2,000 sets remaining, accounting for both those in your possession and in our possession. We are formulating our ideas as soon as possible.
