Without my having been there to actually experience that environment I could only evaluate your activity on the basis of my own surroundings, or others with which I have had contact. In order to adequately make judgements about what is being done in Boulder I am convinced that one has to personally experience it. On the other hand, I feel just as strongly that what works in Boulder will not neccessarily succeed elsewhere. It seems to me that any prejudice against your group for undertaking this activity would be just as unfounded as criticism against other readers for not taking similar action. It will be fascinating to follow the progress of your programs over time, and to see if they continue to flourish and have applications in other areas. I admire your pioneering spirit. .
