#### BRINGING AN END TO THE WAR BETWEEN THE SEXES NANCY SHAFFER SUB 214-216

During the last half of the twentieth century, women in the industrialized societies of the Western World have enjoyed greater individual rights than women have at any other time in history. Yet oppression and mistreatment of women is not a thing of the past: In many of the world's societies women are still regarded as second-class citizens, as chattel. Modern societies have not resolved the conflict between the desire of women for expanded rights and opportunities outside the home and the need to create strong and stable families.

This break-out session will look at some possibilities for the future evolution of gender roles and relations in our society and institutions, focusing on gender as a *complement of being*; a *dual phase of personality manifestation*, and as an essential aspect of our evolving *spiritual natures*.

Nancy has been a practicing attorney for over 20 years and is interested in the study of women's issues in the workplace. A *Urantia Book* reader since 1971, she is currently a member of the IUA Coordinating Committee and Chair of its Legal Committee.

In the late 1960s, Mo owned a health food store/art shop and read *The Urantia Book*. Thirty years later, Mo is still into health foods and he still reads *The Urantia Book*. Today Mo is Chairman of Celestial Seasonings, Inc. In addition to being a family man with a lovely wife, 5 children, and recently a grandaughter, Mo does extensive profit and non-profit work. Mo serves on 7 Boards of Directors, 3 of publically traded NASDAQ companies and 4 private organizations. He served as a General Councilor and Executive Committee member of The Fellowship for 16 years, and is now a Trustee of Urantia Foundation.

#### The Large-Scale Structure of the Universe-Observed and Revealed Irwin Ginsburgh, Ph.D.; Douglas Scott, Ph.D.; and Dan Massey

Recent advances in observational astronomy have provided three-dimensional maps of the distribution of galaxies in space that show universe organization on a larger scale than was known in the early part of the century. *The Urantia Book* describes universe organization on a similarly vast scale from a revelatory perspective. Douglas Scott will present an overview of current work by cosmologists on large-scale structure. Irwin Ginsburgh will discuss the significance of this work for our understanding of the cosmology of *The Urantia Book*. Dan Massey will host and moderate the discussion.

Douglas Scott is a member of the UBC faculty in the Department of Physics and Astronomy. His research interests include theoretical cosmology, cosmic microwave background, and structure formation.




